#### THE PROGRAM/RESEARCH AND INSTRUCTIONAL TOPICS

The North American Research Symposium on Purchasing and Supply Chain Management provides a unique forum for academicians and practitioners to share completed research, discuss future programs and instructional innovations, motivate involvement, support collaboration and encourage increased interdisciplinary research in purchasing and supply management. The program includes: addresses by senior business leaders, provocative

panel discussions, presentations of competitively selected original research papers, sessions on instructional techniques and material, and scheduled time for discussion and networking. In addition, the program focuses on giving researchers the opportunity to exchange ideas on topics relevant to supply management.

#### PAPER SUBMISSION PROCESS

Papers, abstracts and proposals must include:

- Cover page including author name(s) and contact information
- Keywords that best describe the paper's subject area
- Submission category: competitive, working, practitioner, session proposal or teaching case

Additional requirements:

- All submissions must be in MS Word.
- Papers should not have been previously published.
- Papers should not exceed 30 pages.
- Papers should conform to the writing guidelines that are online at www.ism.ws/files/Education/2012NARSWriting Guidelines.pdf.
- Authors are responsible for checking their spelling and grammar, and should ensure that their paper meets formatting requirements.
- Submit the agreement to nars@ism.ws.

Each submission will undergo a blind review and will be rated on:

- Appropriateness of the topic for this symposium
- Organization and logical flow of ideas
- Theoretical soundness
- Appropriateness of the research methodology (sample, data collection and analysis, statistical methods)
- Contribution to research or instruction

A signed author agreement is required from each author identified in your paper. The agreement form is available as a link on the Academic and Student Opportunities page on the ISM website at www.ism.ws/3144.

By submitting an abstract, paper, proposal or case, the authors certify their intention to register for and attend the symposium to present the paper, and agree to have their paper included in the *Symposium Proceedings*, which will be published in electronic format on the web only.

#### SUGGESTED TOPICS

Buyer Behavior, Communications, Distribution, Ethics, Globalization, Government Purchasing, Innovation, Inventory Control, Investment Recovery, Lean, Logistics, Materials Management, Negotiation, Organization, Packaging, Performance Measurements, Quality, Risk Management, Services Purchasing, Strategic Planning, Supplier Alliances, Supplier Diversity, Supplier Relationships, Supply Chain Management, Sustainability and Social Responsibility, Technology.

#### SYMPOSIUM PAPER CATEGORIES

**Competitive Papers** are, in principle, complete papers suitable for journal publication. One paper is selected each year to be awarded the Best Paper. Only papers submitted as Competitive Papers are considered for this award.

**Working Papers** indicate a "work in progress." Authors should submit an extended abstract of at least five pages in length. The abstract must clearly present your research question(s) and the actual or proposed methodology.

**Practitioner Papers** can only be submitted by practitioners themselves. Submissions should be objective in their approach, and should not be in the form of commercial, promotional material for a business or product. Main options for the content of practitioner papers are best practice case studies (e.g., implementation of a new organizational structure) or topical reviews (e.g., a comparison of e-procurement tools). The abstract must be at least five pages in length to be considered.

**Session Proposals** — innovative sessions on research or pedagogical issues — are invited. The proposal should include the topic(s) to be discussed and the format (e.g., panel discussion, invited papers, etc.), proposed participants and length of time required. The proposal must be at least two pages in length to be considered.

**Teaching Case Studies** must present a detailed discussion of a realistic supply management situation or scenario, either actual or simulated, designed to assist the college or university instructor in demonstrating and illustrating key concepts in the classroom. Case studies must include substantial teaching notes and related discussion points in order to be accepted for review and presentation.
