

LUIS BITENCOURT

Dr. Luis Bitencourt is professor of National Security Affairs at the CHDS and Associate Dean for National Security Studies, since July 2005. Prior to joining NDU, Dr. Bitencourt was the Director of the project *Brazil* (2000-2005) at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars and Visiting Professor at the Georgetown University.

For most of his professional life, Dr. Bitencourt pursued simultaneously two careers. In the Brazilian federal administration, he performed several functions related to research and training in strategic planning, international security, public administration, and intelligence (1974-1999). In the Catholic University of Brasilia, Dr. Bitencourt was a professor and dean (1987-2000). He also worked for the United Nations as a Regional Coordinator in East Timor, as a member of the Team of Electoral Experts in Tajikistan, and as a rapporteur for the International Commission on Intervention and State Sovereignty.

At Georgetown University, Dr. Bitencourt has taught courses on Brazilian Political Culture and teaches Marketing in Times of Globalization.

He has a doctorate and a M.A. in World Politics from the Catholic University of America, and a M.A. in Political Science from the Universidade de Brasilia. His Bachelor's Degree is in Mathematics. His research interests include hemispheric security, democracy, trade and marketing.

Dr. Bitencourt is a Honoris Causa professor of the Inter-American Defense College.
