Session Description:

Most organizations have already discovered that there is potential ROI in sustainability, and many more organizations are looking for new ways to capture additional market share through sustainability efforts. So the question has moved from why sustainability, to how sustainability? This session provides a step-by-step approach to: 1) Create broad pathways for innovation within the supply chain, 2) Develop frameworks to mobilize additional departments, business centers, suppliers and customers for innovation and sustainability efforts, and 3) Design internal and external scans to gather additional information, support and funding to operationalize sustainability.
