Corey S. Moore served for 22 years in the U.S. Navy as a carrier naval aviator flying the F/A-18 Hornet, attaining the rank of captain. In his combined active and reserve careers, he accumulated more than 2,800 flight hours in tactical jet aircraft and over 400 carrier landings.

Moore received a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of California, Los Angeles. He also completed the UCLA Executive Management Program, UCLA Marketing Program and Wharton School Financial Management Program. He is a graduate of Harvard Business School's Advanced Management Program.
